






#### The ,elusive' link between health spending and health outcomes at system level


Life expectancy gains and increased health spending, 1995-2014



Thirty-day mortality after admission to hospital for AMI based on linked data




Note: 95% confidence intervals have been calculated for all countries, represented by grey areas.

Publish and promote clinical guidelines



Change financial incentives for providers
Changes in DRG prices, best practice tariffs, episode-based payments, outcome-based adjustments, etc.



Public reporting on individual providers and feedback
